Visiting Greg Kochersperger's RV-10

Last month we had a great time visiting Greg Kochersperger's RV-10 project.

It was a beautiful morning and we had quite a few members come out and examine his plane. Greg's family joined in the fun and we all enjoyed a few delicious breakfast tacos to keep our tummy's happy while we pondered Greg's progress.

Currently, Greg is focused on finishing the fuselage part of the build. The wings are finished and in storage off site.

The RV-10 is the largest of Vans' offerings and is also the most intensive and complicated to build.

Many RV-10 builders opt to add air conditioning. Greg is one of those. His is using a belt driven compressor running off the ring gear (requires a special flywheel pulley). The refrigerant line then are piped to a expansion coil (heat exchanger) located aft of the baggage area, and a condenser coil that fits in a cool P-51 style belly scoop.

The install is very well executed using all the kit's components.

It is a lot of work, but should keep those passengers very comfortable on those hot Texas summer flights.

The meeting was adjourned at 19:45

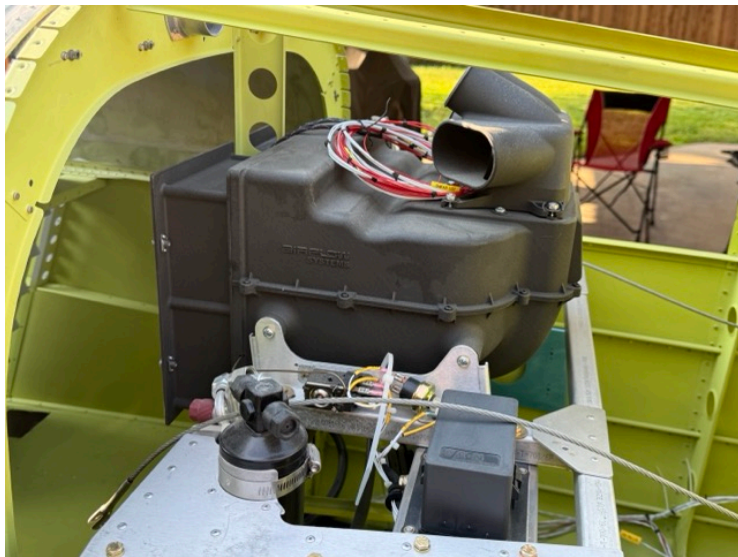


Dual Garmin G3Xs in Greg's RV-10 IFR panel. Missing in the stack is the Garmin Navigator and the radio

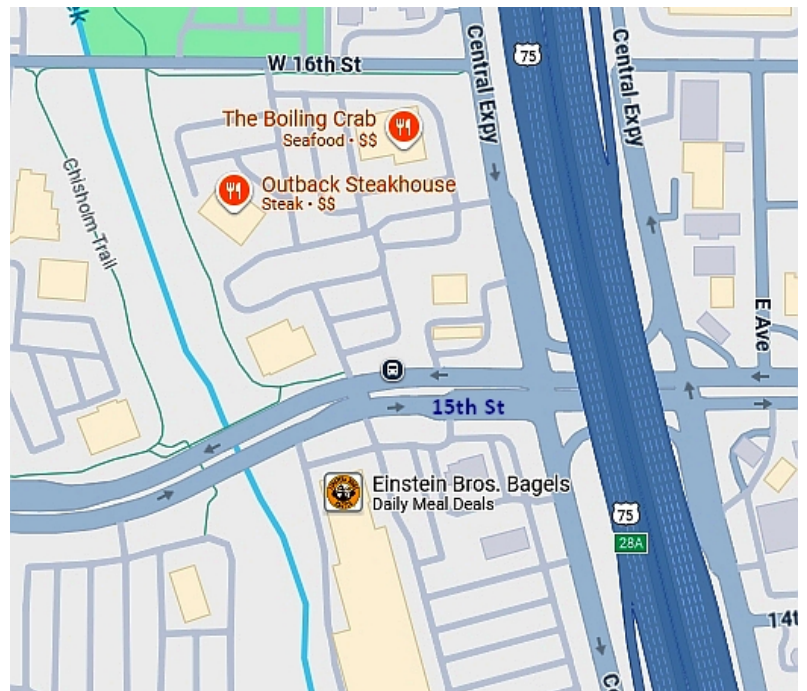
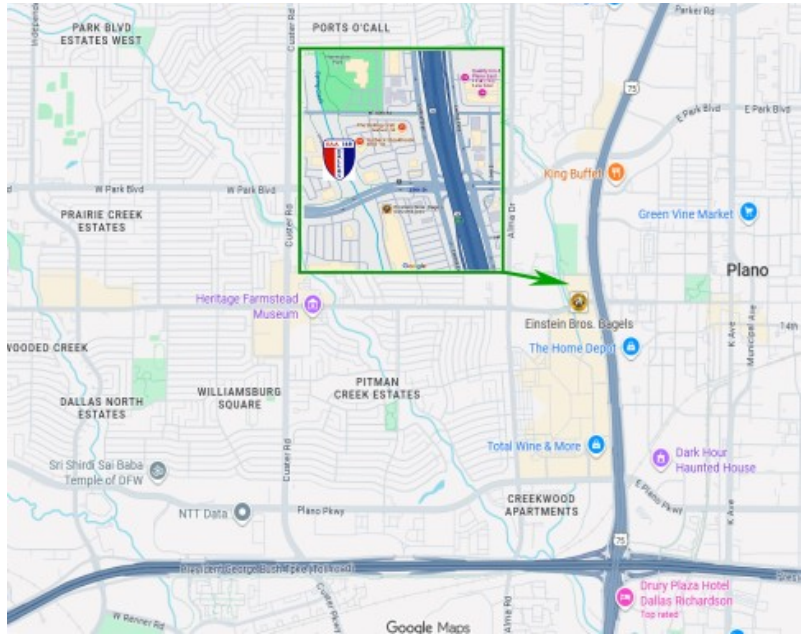

Project Updates

It has been a few months since we had some project updates, so lets do a few.

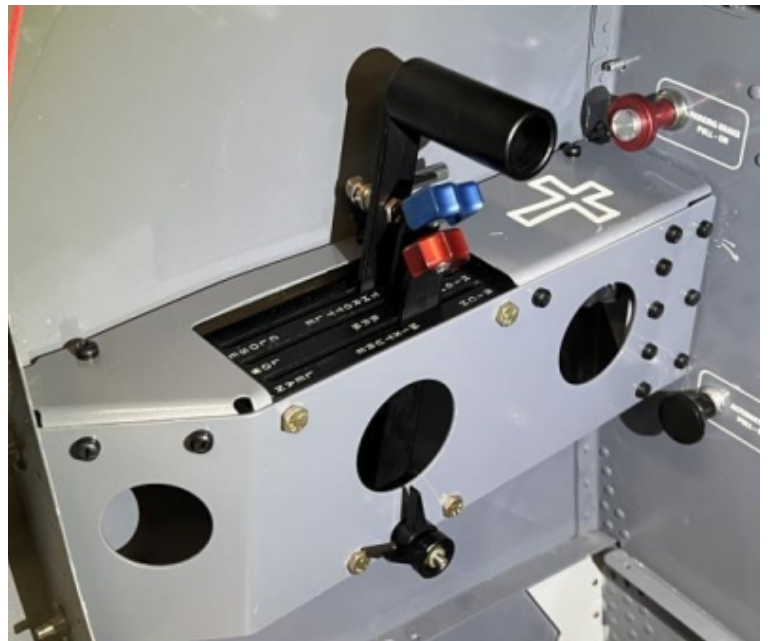
This month we have two. One that is nearing completion and one that is ready to fly.

First, let's look in on Jim Novak's RV-8 project. It has been a while since we have seen his project. He is currently working on all those details firewall forward.

The exhaust is installed, and Jim is using the Vetterman 4-pipe variation. I use the same on my engine and it makes good power. Like myself, Jim is also using the Airflow Performance fuel controller for his injected engine. With the controller installed, he can hook up the control cables to the throttle quadrant and get that geometry and travel correct.

Jim also the alternators installed. yes, that is correct.. alternators. He has the primary belt driven one installed on the ring gear, which we all use to, but also has the back up alternator on that is mounted on the vacuum pump pad on the accessory case.

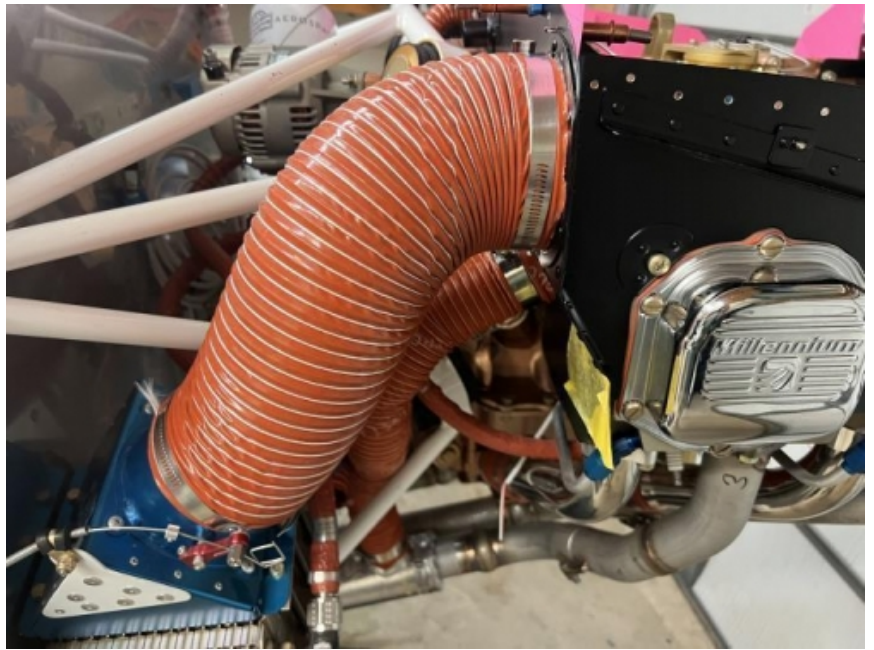
Jim chose to remote mount the oil cooler on the firewall. It is fed with a scat tube on the back of the baffles. Installing it there does give him some flexibility. He has added a adjustable flap that allows for controlling how much air goes through the cooler. That is nice for the XP-360 which has difficulty getting the oil hot enough on some of our cold winter days. It is a good option and a nice install.

Another detail that caught my eye was the way Jim hung those four exhaust. Hanging them from the sump on the engine doesn't work well with his cold air induction sump. So the easiest way to hang them is from the engine mount tubing, but it needs to be flexible to account for engine movement in the mount. He did this using large pieces of thick rubber. Very nice install.

Keep plugging away at it Jim and this airplane will be flying soon.

Speaking of flying soon, that brings us to our second update. A project very close to me (it is a few row south of me at GPM).

Ted Harrison has received his airworthiness certificate and has all the parts on it needed to make that first flight. He has pulled it out of the hangar and ran that Titan O-375 engine and made all the tweaks to the engine and the instruments to prepare it for first flight, which I expect to be very soon.
